Level 3 Entry requirements

To be successful in Level 3 you need:

- reading skills
- writing skills
- maths skills
- computer skills [and a reliable internet connection]

We have free basic computer skills courses, and a range of other courses that can help.

Being prepared is the best way to be successful. If you have doubts about your readiness for Level 3 study you can speak with one of our team to check/discuss options. Email dohsms@ara.ac.nz to arrange this.

English language

This programme has open entry, however English language requirements apply. If English isn't your first language you may be required to provide evidence of your English language skills.

Please refer to our website for relevant IELTS information. If you have no evidence of your English language skills and you're a New Zealand citizen or resident, please contact us for an assessment.

Please note:

- All pathways are offered in Christchurch
- Only the Health & Science pathway is offered in Timaru (in February)
- The first number in the course code indicates the level (eg CSEP300 is a Level 3 course)
- All courses are 15 credits and the whole programme of four courses totals 60 credits
- Completion of the certificate does not mean automatic entry into your chosen programme. Graduates of this programme must apply and meet all requirements of their destination programme
- If your goal is a degree, you'll also need to complete the New Zealand Certificate in Study and Employment Pathways Level 4
- The maximum period of time to complete the programme is two years. Extensions may be approved in some circumstances by the Head of Department

Level 4 Entry requirements

Academic

40 credits NCEA Level 2, including 10 Level 1 Literacy credits and 10 Level 1 Mathematic credits (with a strength in Algebra for the Engineering, and Construction & ICT Pathways and Numeracy for other pathways).

Please note that statistics and probability credits do not count towards this mathematics credits requirement.

Alternative

If you can demonstrate tertiary study skills (including literacy and numeracy) gained through work and/or life experience, you may be eligible for alternative entry. Literacy and numeracy assessments are available.

English language

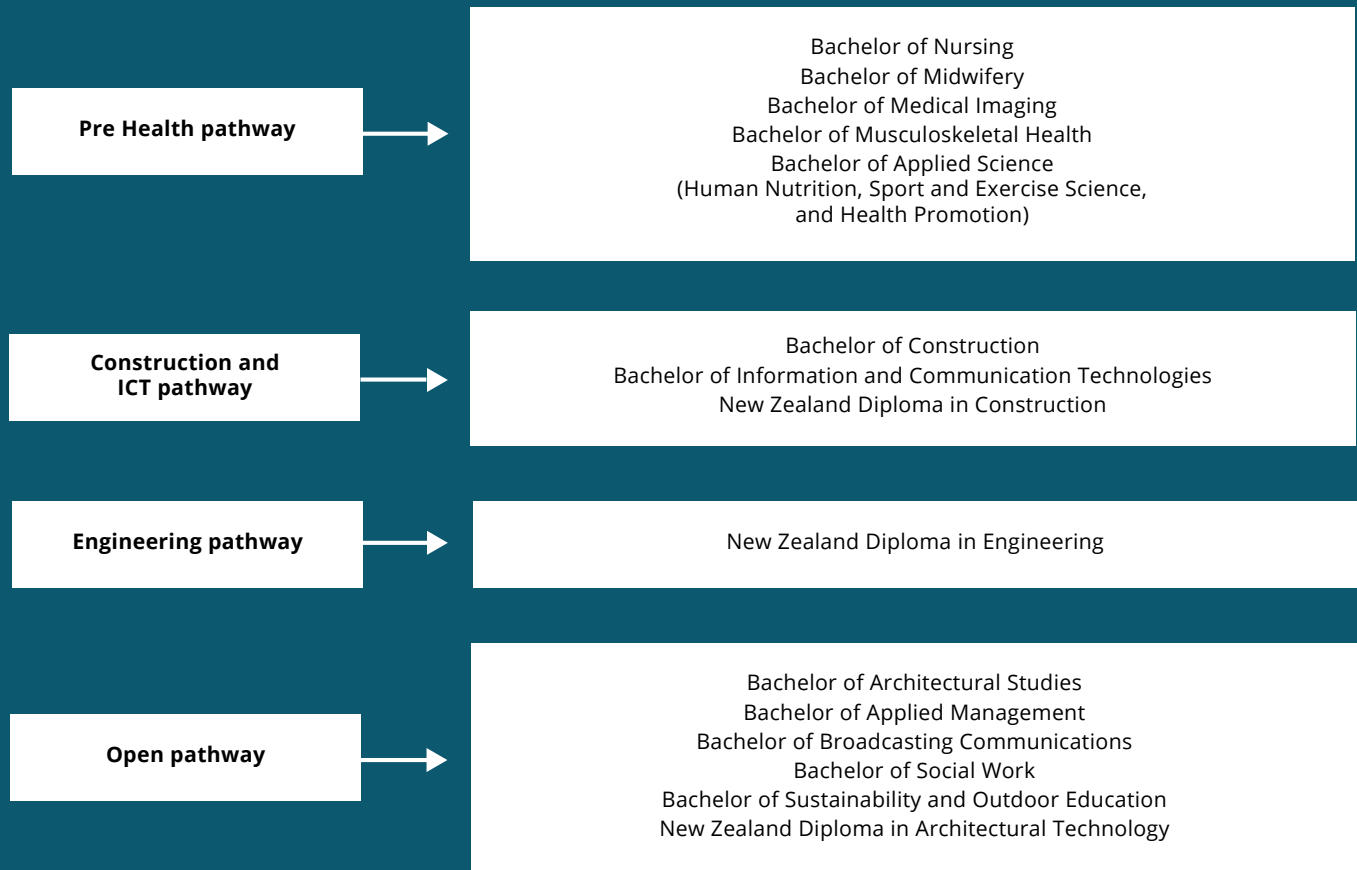
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Please note:

- All pathways are offered in Christchurch; only the Pre-Health pathway is offered in Timaru and online
- All courses are available on-site and some are available online
- Not all courses are offered during both semesters
- All courses are 15 credits and the whole programme totals 60 credits
- Completion of the certificate does not mean automatic entry into degree programmes (other requirements may apply). Entry into health degrees at Ara is competitive; often the number of applicants exceeds the number of places available
